

Code of Conduct

The Club's Annual General Meeting held on 28 November, 2021 endorsed the following Code of Conduct previously approved by the Board as a Club By-Law on 22 September, 2021.



CODE OF CONDUCT

The aim of this Code of Conduct is that Members and Guests have a right to:

- Be treated fairly, equally and with respect by the Club, its Board, its Committees and other Members.
- Socialise in an environment free from all forms of harassment and discrimination.
- Privacy and confidentiality concerning records, documentation and any other communication containing a member's personal information, unless consent is otherwise provided.

All Members and Visitors at the Club:

- Shall comply with all COVID Safety Plan requirements as required by NSW Government orders and any other Government orders affecting Club operations.
- Shall support staff, managers and Directors to meet their Responsible Service of Alcohol and Gambling legal responsibilities and comply with any directions given.
- Shall follow all reasonable instructions given by Club Management and staff
- Shall refrain from any form of sexual harassment and respect the rights, dignity of others
- Shall not behave in any way that will damage the reputation of the Clovelly Bowling Club and Recreation Club
- Shall not partake of/or induce any other person to partake of any illicit drugs on the premises
- Shall uphold the Club's dress code at all times.
- Shall refrain from smoking, aside from in the designated smoking areas.
- Are required to behave in a manner conducive to the enjoyment of the Club's facilities for all persons. Offensive language, or behaviour will not be tolerated.
- All sporting or social groups sponsored by the Club will be required to ensure that its members are members of Clovelly Bowling Club Limited.
- Any person or Group found to have damaged Club property will be held accountable for the repair and or reparation of such damage.

NOTE:

- Club Management reserves the right to refuse entry to any person at its sole discretion.
- All decisions are final in all matters relating to dress and behaviour.
- Failure to comply with any of the above may be deemed as a breach of the Code of Conduct.
- In the event of a breach by a Member or visitor, Clovelly Bowling and Recreation Club Board reserves the right to discipline the offender as per its Constitution (including its By-Laws and Disciplinary Policy).

ACCEPTANCE:

• Members and visitors will be deemed to have accepted this Code of Conduct by attending the Club's premises.

In Memoriam

VALE Giovanni Varnier 28th August 1930 - 5th August 2021



Giovanni was a long-time member (No. 87B) of the Clovelly Bowling Club. He and his wife Celestina loved the friendships, socialising and playing Bocce in the mornings, enjoying a lunch, and putting the occasional \$20 through the pokies.

They would enjoy the beautiful aspect of the Clovelly bowling greens, the views, the fresh air and occasionally when it rained, bowling on the mats indoors and playing cards.

Then there were the New Year's Eve parties with the children and grandchildren attending. Regrettably Celestina passed away when Giovanni was 79 and left a huge hole in his life. He found a lot of comfort in his Clovelly Bowling Club friends and looked forward to socialising and playing Bocce and occasionally bowls at Club.

He was still driving himself to the Bowling Club up until just short of his 90th birthday when he decided it was best to hand in his licence, but nothing would stop him from going to the Club and he was always up early on Thursdays and Sundays ready for Claude or Paula to drive him to the Club. Regrettably COVID prevented him from attending the Club in recent months, but he played right up to the lockdown and was very happy to have attended the ANZAC Day memorial service and function and to have caught up with so many of the members, some who had not played for some time.

Giovanni (John) Varnier was born in Gaiarine Treviso Italy. He was the fifth born of 10 siblings. At the age of 18 he took up an opportunity to work in Australia. Arriving in Sydney on the 19th of August 1949, he travelled to Lismore thereafter taking up various construction, mining, tunnelling and water pipeline projects in rural NSW and Queensland. Several years later he met his beloved wife, Celestina and they married in October 1957 and



had their two children, Claude and Paula. Giovanni continued to work as a Carpenter and later a Building Foreman and retired at the age of 55.

Giovanni passed away just short of his 91st birthday. He is survived by

his children Claude and Paula, and grandchildren Lucas and Bronte. He lived a long and good life and was regarded by many as one of life's finest gentlemen.

11th August 1935 - 22nd November 2021



Our Website





You may know that the Club has a website which has the URL (Uniform Resource Locators) – or web address.

www.clovellybowlingclub.com.au

It is an amazing tool that we use to inform the public about our Club and it is very popular. It gives us a good idea of who is wanting to know about us and where they are from.

For instance, in the period from 1st January this year to the 24th February we have had 1,801 visits. 1,155 of those were first time visitors and the rest were returning. 1,325 were directed from Google, 366 came by typing the URL in themselves and the rest were from theurbanlist.com, Facebook or unknown.

We know that 1,459 were on mobile phones, 324 were on desktop computers and 18 were on a tablet.

Of these 'hits' to the website 1,755 were from Australia, 30 from the UK, 11 from the US, 6 from Italy and then one each from NZ, Canada and Spain.

The most read page, with 1,190 views, was the Homepage (seen to the left) then Barefoot Bowling with 868 views, Functions with 318, Contact Us with 154 and Bowling with 143.

The website is set up with a menu of pages which includes:


Some pages are interactive and can be used to request a Barefoot Bowls booking or Function. A form is filled out online which is then sent to the staff who can respond personally. Since the start of 2022 until February 24 we have had 103 inquiries from the website. When you see staff on the computer there is a good chance they are replying to these requests - it's a big job!

If we look at the graph to the left with the two previous years compared, we can clearly see the impact that COVID has made

on our Club. Traffic is down by 56% due to lockdown. Can you see the effect the recent rain has had to the amount of hits in the last week? Figures before COVID were much higher and will become high again soon as COVID fades away.

It is interesting isn't it? It is also very important. It helps us to track trends and ensure we are stocked with drinks, food and enough staff to service the expected number of visitors. And that is important because the money we earn means we can stay open and do what were are all really wanting to do - PLAY BOWLS!

On the 10th August a film shoot for an advertisement was held at the Club under strict COVID supervision including from the local constabulary!




